








NATIONALITY BREAKDOWN


WITH THE CLOSING OF THREE

Total Participants Per Team




Single Identity Practices

Total Number of Single Indentity Practices




IMAGINE


'Imagine' is an Educational
Program on Anti-racism Education/
Education for a Culture of Peace
launched in October 2017, where
classes from the two communities
are paired and attend sports
activities with Peace Players –
Cyprus (PP-CY), where children
develop skills for teamwork,
tolerance and trust through sports
activities.

PeacePlayers provides "Imagine Trainers" so run the bi-communal workshops, a position that we prioritize for our young assistant coaches to gain more youth development experience. This year we have partnered with Imagine to provide 560 participants from all over the island the opportunity to engage with PeacePlayers teambuilding and basketball activities.

Imagine Participants by Location




The Imagine activity not only introduces young children to PeacePlayers programming, but allows our Assistant Coaches to build their capacity as youth development professionals.

Twinnings & Tournaments give a majority of our kids a chance to interact with "the other side, while the Retreats, Leadership Activities, and Exchanges allow our leaders to dive deeper into exploring those relationships.

LEADERSHIP

Our Leadership Development Program (LDP) has three tiers. Juniors (JDP), Leaders (LDP) and Assistant Coaches (ACs). As our participants get older, they have the opportunity to continue learning about peace advocacy, playing basketball, and building relationships through this pipeline.
