PeacePlayers International ("PeacePlayers") is a global organization that uses the power of sport to unite, educate and inspire young people to create a more peaceful and equitable world. PeacePlayers was founded in 2001 on the premise that children who play together can learn to live together. Using basketball, PeacePlayers bridges divides, changes perceptions and develops leaders among youth from divided communities.

PeacePlayers is the recipient of numerous awards including the Laureus Sport for Good Award, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Sports Award, and the Sport for Reduced Racial Inequalities Collective Impact Award. With partnerships with organizations such as Nike, the NBA Players Association Foundation, and the Arbinger Institute, and a dedicated Board including leaders in sport such as Steve Kerr, Jessica Gelman and R.C. Buford, PeacePlayers is widely recognized as the global leader in the sport for peacebuilding field.

PeacePlayers International operates programs in Northern Ireland, South Africa, Cyprus, the Middle East and also several cities in the United States. They offer sport programming, peace education, and leadership development to youth from undervalued and divided communities.

Over the past 20 years, PeacePlayers International has trained over 2,000 coaches and has partnered with 260 different schools and non-profit organizations. As of 2020, over 125,000 children have been impacted through PeacePlayers' programs, and these programs continue to bring children together through sport to form positive relationships, develop leadership skills and improve their futures.

In January of 2017, PeacePlayers launched a partnership with Nike to bring PeacePlayers' proven model of uniting communities through sport to the United States. This exciting partnership that continues today brought PeacePlayers to Baltimore, Brooklyn and Detroit, and then added programs in Chicago and Los Angeles. Given the dramatic programmatic growth over the last two years, PeacePlayers has strategically decided to formalize a PeacePlayers U.S. entity that will own the strategic direction of PeacePlayers' sustainability and growth in the United States, alongside supporting the organization-wide global network.

Partnering with Nike and community stakeholders, youth ages 8-18 experience high caliber basketball programming, engage in a peace education and leadership curriculum, and connect with other PeacePlayers around the world. Over time, young people build skills, sportsmanship, self-esteem, and become leaders and advocates for a more peaceful and equitable United States. THE OPPORTUNITY

PeacePlayers United States is seeking a dynamic leader to join the U.S. team as the Executive Director. This is a unique opportunity for a talented, driven individual to lead a strong organization with tremendous potential and advance it in its next chapter and beyond.

The Executive Director will lead the U.S. efforts of PeacePlayers, the newest and largest of the five international PeacePlayers sites. The Executive Director will have overall strategic, operational, and managerial responsibility for the U.S. including oversight of the \$1.6M annual budget and staff of 15+; both of which are targeted to grow significantly in this next chapter.

Key responsibilities include:

Leadership

- Lead, build and inspire a talented and dedicated team, inclusive of U.S. national and local (Baltimore, Brooklyn, Chicago, Detroit, and Los Angeles) staff, and help launch new program site in Portland.
- Develop a strong, national hub that will support the local sites in fundraising, marketing and communications, finance, programming, and networking.
- Collaborate closely with PeacePlayers Global, along with PeacePlayers International's Founder and President, to develop a multi-year strategy focused on financial sustainability and growth that is in line with the PeacePlayers Global Strategic Plan.
- Serve on the Global Leadership Team with other country directors to collaborate in maximizing global impact.
- Work with Global Executive Director and PeacePlayers International's Founder and President to recruit and develop a strong and impactful PeacePlayers U.S. Inaugural Board of Directors.
- Work with external stakeholders (key liaison with Nike) and demonstrate professionalism and leadership to support the ongoing partnership needs.
- Adhere to operational excellence while providing the management support of the PeacePlayers U.S. entity.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Fundraising and Development

- Lead all planning, strategy, and execution of fundraising for U.S. programs by working closely with PeacePlayers International's Founder and President to understand the current financial landscape and existing donor base, and identify opportunities for new financial support in the U.S.
- Work closely with U.S. markets to develop regional and local fundraising strategies. Develop and expand local and national fundraising activities to support existing program operations and national expansion.
- Spend time in-market in Baltimore, Brooklyn, Chicago, Detroit and Los Angeles to build relationships with staff and assess areas of need for local sustainability.
- Collaborate with PeacePlayers Global and U.S. staff to effectively steward existing U.S. focused donors and build a pipeline of future supporters of PeacePlayers work in the U.S.
- Support and identify tentpole, national opportunities to activate and sustain interest in U.S. programs (for example, holding basketball tournaments in all U.S. markets over MLK weekend in January).

Financial Performance and Operations

- Adhere to PeacePlayers' unifying principles. These "unifying principles" ensure all PeacePlayers international sites are similar enough to each other to achieve the shared mission of the organization and also afford the flexibility for local leaders in each site to innovate and make contextually- driven decisions for the greatest overall impact.
- Identify and strategically partner with organizations and institutions to deepen, sustain and scale PeacePlayers' programmatic impact across the U.S.
- Collaborate with country directors of other PeacePlayers sites (Northern Ireland, Middle East, South Africa and Cyprus) to share learnings and best practices across sites for the good of the global PeacePlayers network.
- Oversee all budgeting and fiscal management of PeacePlayers U.S.
